

Pup Puzzles for the Win

Rainy days making it hard to exercise your dog?

Try out a "brain game" instead.

Brain games are puzzles, toys, or activities designed to help your pup experiment, problem solve, and be entertained. When you can't exactly stretch their legs, you can always stretch their brains! Plus, they'll love the tasty reward they discover.

Here are a couple brain games that are super quick and easy to make with items you already have on hand.

Hidden Treat Puzzle

Supplies you'll need:

- A plastic container with the lid (A sour cream or yogurt container work great for smaller dogs, but you may need an empty milk jug for larger breeds)
- A sharp knife or scissors
- 3 A handful of your dog's favorite kibble

Steps:

- Wash, rinse, and dry the plastic container and lid.
- Cut a few holes in the lid or the sides of the container (sides are best for the milk jug).
 The holes should be large enough for bits of kibble to pass through, but not so big that several are dispensed at one time.
- 3. Put a handful of kibble into the container and tighten the lid.
- 4. Tada! You've just created your dog's favorite new puzzle.

Your dog should be able to push and roll the container to dispense a few morsels at a time. If it seems more difficult than it should be, poke a few more holes in the container or increase their size.

Kibble Treasure Hunt

(with three difficulty levels)

Supplies you'll need:

- Kibble or small dog treats
- Cardboard boxes (only for "expert" mode)

EASY MODE

- With your dog stashed outside of the room, hide bits of kibble in an easy-to-find place, like under a coffee table or low shelf.
- 2. Bring your dog into the room and let them sniff out their hidden treasure.

HARD MODE

- Choose slightly more difficult hiding places for the kibble, such as placing it inside a container, under a box or behind a blanket in the corner.
- 2. Bring your dog in to sniff it out.

EXPERT MODE

- 1. Place 10-15 cardboard boxes of various sizes around the room.
- 2. Put a dog treat or kibble in a few boxes (or just one if you want to be really stealthy)
- 3. Bring your pup in to search.





Don't get ticked!

3 Natural Remedies to Keep Your Dog Safe

Spring, Summer, and Fall offer the best weather for hiking and exploration across West Michigan, but walking along wooded paths and parks also means the risk of ticks – for you and your pet.

Ticks are tiny parasites that burrow into your dog's fur, hide, and attach themselves to their skin. And because ticks can feed for hours, they have lots of time to transmit any diseases they may be carrying to your beloved pup. That's why it's so important to make a habit of thoroughly checking your pet (and your own skin) after any shaded outing.

There are lots of over-the-counter tick repellents available at your local pet supply or grocery store, or you can try your hand at making these at home remedies with natural products you probably already have in the cupboard. Here are three of our favorites:

Apple Cider Vinegar

Most likely the easiest ingredient to procure and use, apple cider vinegar is a great, natural repellant. Simply add one teaspoon per quart of water to your dog's water bowl! You can also mix ACV with water to create a repellant spray. Just mix equal parts vinegar with water and spray your dog's coat once a day before heading outside.


Essential oils.

Ticks rely on their sense of smell to find a host but are sensitive to several scents. They particularly dislike the scent of essential oils including rose geranium, lavender, citronella, eucalyptus, and lemongrass. Most of these oils should be available at your local health store. Please keep in mind that essential oils are highly concentrated and should be mixed with a carrier oil like coconut or olive, and many are also photosensitive, which means they attract the sun, and could leave your pet more susceptible to overheating or sunburn. To create a repellent spray, simply mix distilled water, a few drops of your essential oil, and either vodka or witch hazel to help disperse the oil throughout the water. There are several recipes available online, but we suggest discussing the proper dosage with your vet.



Fresh garlic.

Just as garlic gives humans pungent breath, garlic in your dog's body escapes through the skin making them less appealing to ticks and other pests. Be aware that because garlic contains sulfoxides and disulfides, large amounts can be unsafe to feed your pup, but in moderation, it's safe for any dog other than pregnant females, puppies under 6 months, or Akitas and Shibalnus. Simply peel and chop the garlic, then let it sit for 15 minutes before adding to your dog's food. Use a level measuring spoon and determine dosage based on your dog's weight:



When it comes to repelling ticks or anything related to your dog's health, our best advice is to always check with your veterinarian first. They'll always help you determine what's best for your bestest, furry friend.

5 Puppy Behaviors *to Nip in the Bud Early*

We can all probably agree there's nothing quite like the soft, squishy joy of having a puppy.

We love their paws, their energy, their snuggles, and even their breath. But anyone will agree, taking care of them is a lot of work.

That's why lots of new pet owners find themselves frustrated or overwhelmed once the puppymoon wears off... and some even choose to rehome their



Jumping pups are just looking for attention, so the best way to dissuade them of this behavior is to ignore them. Literally turn your face or whole body away and stay silent until they've returned all four feet to the floor or sat down. Once they do, wait a second or two and then reinforce the behavior with a treat, pets, and positive affirmation.

2 Poor leash manners.

When a dog is small, poor leash manners are annoying, but they aren't dangerous. However as your pup grows and becomes stronger, you stand a greater risk of being pulled along, or having to chase them as they get loose to chase another dog or squirrel.

3 Barking.

This is how dogs communicate, so it's essential to let your dog know you hear them. Teach them when it's appropriate to bark and when they need to be quiet.



new pet simply for doing normal things puppies do! So how can you distinguish between what's normal, "good" behavior and "bad" habits that should be nipped in the bud?

Determining whether a behavior is "good" or "bad" often starts with you. What one pet parent can tolerate (let's say, jumping up on the furniture) could be an absolute no-no for someone else. So first you have to determine what's appropriate for your home. That said, here are 5 behaviors that can be dangerous and should be stopped.

4) Guarding behavior.

There's a big difference between guarding and aggression. Dogs "guard" when they feel they need to hide or protect what they have (like toys or food). With dogs who tend to "guard," avoid tug-o-war games, and work slowly with them rewarding when they drop a toy and allow you to pick it up. Keep repeating this activity until they're comfortable.

5 Nipping.

Learning bite inhibition (also called having a soft mouth) is crucial to keeping your dog, loved ones, and strangers safe. If your puppy starts nibbling at your fingers and toes while playing, offer a toy instead. If they continue to nip, stop the play session immediately. You can also redirect by asking them to sit and then reward with a toy or treat

How to Create a Balanced Diet for Your Pet

Just like humans, our pets are healthiest when they get plenty of exercise, rest, hydration, and nutritious food. But how do you know if you're feeding them the right balance of nutrients to keep their teeth, bones, joints, organs, and coats healthy?

Research shows that being even just 10 percent overweight can greatly increase your dog's risk of developing serious health conditions such as diabetes, arthritis, urinary stones, or heart disease. And depending on their age, breed, and other factors, the rate can increase. The same is true for cats (and more than 50 percent of America's cat population is currently considered obese).

The good news is there are a few simple things you can do right now to improve your pet's overall health including:

- Taking care to ensure you don't overfeed them
- Cutting out table scraps and feeding them "people food" (which could be toxic!)
- Implementing more daily activity and exercise
- Scheduling a vet appointment to check for any underlying health conditions that could be contributing to your pet's weight gain or loss

The next best thing to do is feed them a balanced, healthy diet. Dogs and cats need a healthy balance of water, proteins, fats, carbohydrates, minerals, and vitamins, and most all of these are often found in packaged foods such as:

- Chicken, beef, lamb, duck, fish, etc. for protein
- Fat from meat or oil
- Carbohydrates like grains and vegetables
- Essential fatty acids (often from fish or plantbased oils)
- Oatmeal and/or eggs

In terms of feeding frequency, dogs should eat at least two meals a day, about 12 hours apart. As for cats, their feeding requirements change multiple times throughout their lives. Kittens usually do best when fed three meals a day until 6 months old. Between 6 months and one year, twice is best. Once they reach adulthood (about 1 year of age), they can be fed once or twice a day, although they tend to graze at their leisure.

A few additional things to consider:

- It's best to select diets with real, whole-food ingredients you recognize. If the ingredient list includes several items that are unfamiliar to you, better to choose something else.
- Unless your vet says otherwise, your cat can have wet or dry food, or a combination of the two, just pay attention to portion sizes. It's also worth mentioning that wet food can help increase your cat's water intake if they're not keen on drinking.
- A cat's diet should consist of roughly 50-60% protein and 30-50% fat which can be adjusted based on their activity level. It's important to note that their protein should come from meat that contains the specific nutrients Taurine and Arginine.
- If you're not sure how much to feed your average adult dog, you can use this formula: 30 x weight in kg (or pounds divided by 2.2) + 70 = daily caloric need.
- Look for labels that say, "complete" versus "complementary." Complete meets dietary requirements for vitamins, minerals, and nutrients while complementary is code for treats.

As a pet owner, the most responsible and loving thing you can do for your pet is ensure they have exercise, socialization, grooming, veterinary care, and a good, healthy diet as outlined above. If you're ever unsure of what's right for your dog or cat, don't hesitate to ask your vet, as they're the best resource and know your animal well.



Homemade Dog Food Recipe

Ingredients

- 1 pound ground turkey
- 6 cups water
- 2 cups brown rice
- 1 tsp dried rosemary
- ½ 1/2 (16 oz) package frozen broccoli, carrots, and cauliflower combination

Directions

Place ground turkey, water, rice, and rosemary into a large Dutch oven. Stir until ground turkey is broken up and evenly distributed throughout the mixture; bring to a boil over high heat, then reduce heat to low and simmer for 20 minutes.

Add frozen vegetables and cook for an additional 5 minutes. Remove from heat and cool. Refrigerate until using.

For additional calcium, consider sprinkling eggshell powder over the mixture before serving. To prepare it, simply rinse out your eggshells then bake for 10 minutes in a 300-degree oven to get them nice and brittle. Transfer to a blender and crush until they turn to powder.

Feel free to vary the recipe as preferred, adding 6 beaten eggs into the boiling mix as it cooks, or alter the vegetables.

- ¼ cup low sodium chicken broth
- ³/₄ cup carrots
- ½ cup peas


Directions

First cook and mash the veggies (boil the carrots, and heat the peas through), and make the rice according to the instructions on the box or bag. Next, cook the chicken breast thoroughly and shred it into small, bite-sized pieces. In a mixing bowl, combine the cooked rice, chicken broth, carrots, and peas. Add the shredded chicken to the rice mixture and mix well. Serve the meal only after it has cooled completely to room temperature.
